Through this notice, TSASK would like to remind employers that it is their responsibility to ensure that their operators are not only certified, but licensed as the appropriate class to operate within the scope of their authority. For verification, TSASK offers a directory on our website that will list the information pertaining to the class in which a power engineer is licensed.

As a power engineer operating in Saskatchewan, it is your individual responsibility to ensure that you are licensed.
